**WHAT DO YOU THINK ABOUT THE AREA COVERED BY UPPINGHAM'S
NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN?**

A number of community groups in Uppingham are working together to come up with a plan that will help shape development in the town for many years to come.

An Uppingham Town Neighbourhood Plan (UTNP) is being prepared by the Town Council, who are leading a local partnership including Uppingham First, Uppingham Town Partnership, Uppingham Neighbourhood Forum, local residents associations, with support from Rutland County Council.

It's one of the first neighbourhood plans in the country and when completed will set out the views of the local Uppingham community by:

- Establishing planning policies for the development and use of land
- Locations within the town where new homes, shops and offices should be built
- The appearance and design of any new buildings constructed

Prior to the publication of the Uppingham Town Neighbourhood Plan, the first step is simply to agree on the area that the plan will cover.

Launching the consultation, Uppingham Town Council has outlined an area that takes in the whole Parish of Uppingham, plus a small area of land south of the A47 bypass in Ayston Parish. You can see exactly the proposed area that the Uppingham Town Neighbourhood Plan will cover by visiting the Rutland County Council website at

www.rutland.gov.uk/neighbourhoodplans .

If you have a strong view or a comment to make about the proposed area, then you must do so between Monday 24th

September and Monday 5th November. Comments should relate to the area that is being proposed, rather than any general thoughts you might have about issues you think should be covered by the plan.

You can submit your views by writing to the Planning Policy Team at Rutland County Council (Catmose, Oakham, Rutland. LE15 6HP) or by email: localplan@rutland.gov.uk

After the consultation has closed on 5 November, Rutland County Council will consider all responses received before making a final decision on the proposed area for the Neighbourhood Plan.

There are vacant allotments on Tod's Piece and the Leicester Road site. The cost for Tod's Piece is £20 p.a. Leicester Road £25 p.a. Now is the time to consider undertaking one to prepare for planting next spring. Further information from the Clerk.

Uppingham Town Council was formed from Uppingham Rural District Council following the establishment of Rutland as a Unitary Authority.

The council has 15 members following a contested election in May 2011.

The council is staffed by a fully qualified clerk, three Town Hall site staff, and a litter picker.

The council and its staff are busy, with stewardship of

- Town hall – which acts as a busy community centre
- Cemeteries. We have 2 in the town
- Allotments. We have two sets within the town
- Open spaces, including Tod's Piece, which is a significant, open space hosting 2 sets of play equipment, a skate park, and a winter football pitch. It also is the leasehold site for a Bowls Club, Football Club building, and a Scout Association building
- The Market Square and a weekly market
- Day to day running of a democratic town council!
