Help with travel

The travel tokens are a national scheme and can be used anywhere in the UK. However it is down to individual operators whether they will accept them or not and that is their decision to do so.

The tokens have a cash value and change is given in cash. You can buy rail cards with them, you can pay for your taxi fare with them (but we advise it is the person's responsibility to check that the tokens will be accepted before they book their journey). VAR accept them also. Rutland County Council issue £44 per year to the applicant. The application form is sent through to Rutland County Council who issue the tokens and each year during March, we contact applicants direct from the year before to see if they wish to renew their claim.

The tokens are very helpful but for those travelling frequently, it is more advisable to claim their free bus pass and then book their journeys with VAR as their passes would be acceptable for half the fare Further information and application from Sally Killips, Rutland County Council,t: 01572 758229
